

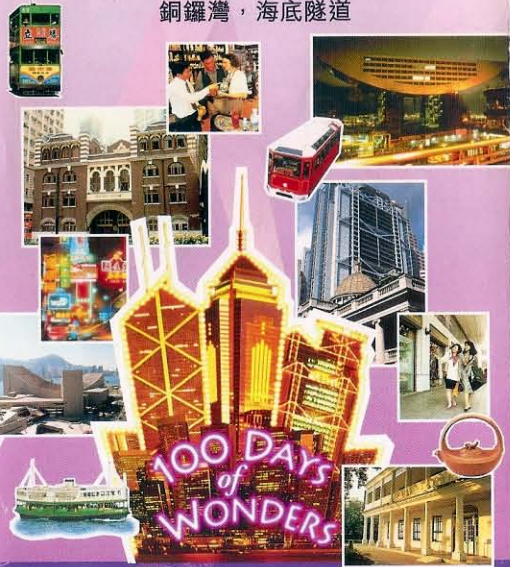

## 魅力巴士100D

### 尖沙咀至中環 (循環線)

途徑：西區海底隧道，上環，金鐘，銅鑼灣，海底隧道



### 遊覽香港時，既想無拘無束，自定行程，但又希望得到參加觀光團一樣的妥善安排和舒適方便，乘坐「魅力巴士100D」沿線觀光便最好不過。

「魅力巴士100D」是九龍巴士有限公司在「香港魅力100」期間特別提供的一條循環巴士線，行走尖沙咀至中環，共有七站，帶您遊覽香港多個著名古蹟、景點及購物中心，行程多姿多采，非常方便。

第一站—尖沙咀天星碼頭

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100D 從尖沙咀天星碼頭開出，碼頭旁矗立的鐘樓，建於1921年，原是火車總站的一部份。火車總站遷拆後，改建文化中心，設計別具特色，裡面設有大型劇院、音樂廳，全球其中一個最大的太空館和展覽中外文物的藝術館，觀光之餘，還可盡情購物、海運大廈、海洋廊、半島酒店及麗晶酒店商場、星光電腦廣場及免稅店等均近在咫尺，從碼頭步行5分鐘即達。



### 第二站—尖沙咀彌敦道

加連威老道、金馬倫道、柏麗購物大道及彌敦道，組成一個包羅萬象的購物天堂，價廉物美，值得慢慢瀏覽，搜尋超值精品。旁為九龍公園，園內聚集各種珍貴雀鳥，又設有香港博物館，和傳統伊斯蘭建築的清真寺，都是漫步的好去處。



### 第三站—上環信德中心

銷售布疋、工藝品的西港城，將購物和觀光共冶一爐，鄰近有以紅磚建築的香港醫學博物館以及供奉孔聖和關帝的文武廟。信步前行便是文咸東街，中藥店舖林立，人參及各式名貴藥材一應俱全。喜愛古玩文物的話，附近的荷里活道必然令您流連忘返。



### 第七站—紅磡海底隧道收費廣場

在此站下車後步行約15分鐘，即達香港科學館，有500多件先進互動式展品，並會定期更換，愛好科學的人士及充滿好奇心的兒童都不可不到。如欲到新界遊覽，可在此站轉乘火車或巴士，購物可到尖沙咀東部或紅磡的出口店。



### 第六站—銅鑼灣崇光百貨公司

銅鑼灣是最受香港市民歡迎的購物區，您可以漫步渣甸坊，瀏覽街上的各式商店，或者到舒適豪華的時代廣場、利舞台廣場及多家大型日本百貨公司，挑選林總總的精品百貨。每天中午，海旁都會舉行鳴放午炮的傳統儀式，為您重演電影的經典場面。



### 第五站—金鐘地鐵站

在本站下車可到太古廣場，堪稱全港最高級的豪華購物中心，附近的金鐘廊有各式商店，皇后大道東則以傢俬傢具著稱。毗鄰的香港公園，景色秀麗，更設有茶具文物館，是香港歷史最悠久的歐陸建築物。



### 第四站—中環怡和大厦

中環是香港的金融商業中心，建築物風格獨特，如歐陸式的立法局和盡顯現代建築工程成就的匯豐銀行總行。徐氏藝術館藏有超過3,000件中國木刻、象牙、傢具、銅器及陶瓷藝術品。太子大廈和置地廣場，名牌精品琳瑯滿目，利源東西街則有各式各樣的特價貨品。中環海陸交通工具齊全，往香港仔、淺水灣、赤柱、海洋公園、太平山頂和外島遊覽都十分方便。

If you crave the flexibility and independence of a self-guided tour, but aren't quite ready to give up the security and organisation of a guided tour, then the **Wonders Bus 100D** is your ticket. The seven stops on this special circular Kowloon Motor Bus route from Tsim Sha Tsui to Central put you in close proximity to some of Hong Kong's most historic landmarks and exciting shopping areas. Get off at any stop and spend as much time as you need exploring and shopping in the area.

Stop 1 - Tsim Sha Tsui, Star Ferry Pier

Synchronise your watch with our historic Clock Tower. Built in 1921, this clock originally graced the railway station before being moved to the forecourt of the Cultural Centre. The unique architectural wonders house theatres for large-scale performances, one of the world's largest planetariums and a gallery of Chinese and Western art. Don't tire yourself out with sightseeing though, because this stop puts you at the gateway to shopping Heaven - Ocean Terminal, Ocean Centre, The Peninsula and Regent shopping arcades, Star House Computer City and Duty Free Shoppers are all within a 5-minute walk from the Star Ferry.



Stop 2 - Tsim Sha Tsui, Nathan Road

Granville Road, Cameron Road, Park Lane and Nathan Road are the original Shopper's Paradise, so spend some time wandering around for special bargains. For sightseeing we recommend a stroll through Kowloon Park to visit its flocks of exotic birds or the Hong Kong Museum of History, as



well as the traditional Kowloon Mosque and Islamic Centre.

Stop 3 - Sheung Wan, Shun Tak Centre

Combine shopping and sightseeing with a visit to the Edwardian Western Market, which now houses fabric, arts and craft stores. The historic red-brick Museum of Medical Science and Man Mo Temple, dedicated to the Taoist Gods of literature and war, are nearby. Another couple of paces and you'll be at the centre of Hong Kong's ginseng and herbal medicine trade along Bonham Strand. If antiques are your fancy, then take your time ambling along Hollywood Road.

Stop 7 - Hung Hom, Cross Harbour Tunnel Toll Plaza



The Hong Kong Science Museum is a must for children and science buffs and is a 15-minute walk from this stop.

Many of the museum's 500 exhibits are interactive and are changed regularly. Side trips to the New Territories on the Kowloon-Canton Railway or buses are best started from here, while shopping opportunities include Tsim Sha Tsui East and factory outlets in Hung Hom.

Stop 6 - Causeway Bay, Sogo Department Store



Causeway Bay is one of the most popular shopping destinations for locals. Jardine's Crescent is where you'll find a street-level shopping experience, while Times Square, Lee Theatre Plaza and the many Japanese department stores offer comfort and selection. The Noon Day Gun, of Noël Coward's "Mad Dogs and Englishmen" fame, is located on the waterfront and is fired daily.

Stop 5 - Admiralty, MTR Station

Pacific Place, arguably Hong Kong's premier shopping mall, is easily-accessible from this stop. From there you could also sample the shops of Queensway Plaza, and the furniture and rattan shops along Queen's Road East. This stop puts you almost at the door of Hong Kong's oldest surviving colonial building, Flagstaff House Museum of Tea Ware, in the beautiful Hong Kong Park.



Stop 4 - Central, Jardine House

This is the business centre of Hong Kong and home to the Legislative Council Building, a colonial building. Among the many noteworthy sites are the Hongkong Bank Building, a wonder of modern architecture and engineering, and Tsui Museum of Art, home to more than 3,000 Chinese wood carvings, ivory, furniture, bronze and ceramics. Shopping in Central ranges from the collections of top designers, found in Prince's Building and the Landmark, to bargains aplenty along Li Yuen Street East and West. If you would like to take a side trip to Aberdeen, Repulse Bay, Stanley, Ocean Park, Victoria Peak or the Outlying Islands, there is plenty of convenient transportation from Central.
